

Student Voters Lean Left — So the Right Is Making It Harder for Them to Vote by Sasha Abramsky, TRUTHOUT

GOP state legislators have sought to make it harder for students — a group that by and large leans left — to vote.

In 2012, Republicans in North Carolina eliminated the ability of 16- and 17-year-olds to preregister to vote so that they would be automatically able to cast their ballots upon turning 18.

The following year, Ohio Republicans sought to penalize colleges that helped out-of-state students register to vote in Ohio, by mandating that they only charge them in-state tuition. This is despite the fact that under Ohio state law, anyone who has lived in the state for 30 consecutive days prior to the election can vote — a very different criterion from the college rules regarding who qualifies for in-state tuition. As a result of this legislative sleight of hand, colleges thought twice before providing students with information on how to vote.

In 2018, the NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund filed a lawsuit against a small county in Texas that students alleged was limiting the number of early voting days allowed on the predominantly Black Prairie View A&M campus. During that election cycle several states, including Florida and Texas, imposed additional hurdles on out-of-state students seeking to vote.

Fast forward to 2024, and GOP-governed states — their legislators in thrall to Donald Trump's oft-debunked theories of rampant voter fraud — are again targeting student voters, seemingly as part of their growing effort to prune voter rolls and limit voter participation among groups that have historically favored the Democrats.

This crackdown follows a period of unprecedented youth voter engagement. As recently as 2012, 20 percent fewer 18- to 24-year-olds voted than was the case for any other eligible age group. Then, Trump came along and, in reaction to the policies that he was proposing on the environment, on abortion access, on immigration, and other key issues, young people started to pay far more attention to politics. That politicization

process accelerated once Trump became president. In 2020, there was a huge surge in youth voter participation, especially among college students — a group in which two-thirds of those eligible to vote did so — helping to produce majorities for Biden in enough swing states to win him the presidency.

The lessons weren't lost on the GOP. In the nearly four years since Trump began fanning the flames of a "stolen election" mythology, GOP legislators have worked out all kinds of ways to make it harder for students in their states to participate in elections.

In Idaho, for example, students can no longer use student IDs to establish their identity at the polls. North Carolina's stringent voter ID law also excludes many colleges' student IDs from use at polling places. In Ohio, out-of-state students who seek to vote at the college they are attending have to give up their home-state ID, including their home-state drivers' license. If they don't want to do that, they have to remember to register to vote in their home states, and to mail in their ballot in time for it to count. Students in Wisconsin recently reported receiving robo-texts warning them that if they voted in the wrong state, they could receive lengthy prison sentences.

Inside Higher Education recently reported that 27 states have, in recent years, passed laws that could have a negative impact on student voter participation. These include bills that target organizations that help people with the voter registration process — which is particularly important for young, and often first-time, voters. In Florida, groups that don't follow the complex process to a tee now risk fines of up to a quarter of a million dollars. As a result, many organizations have pulled back on their voter registration work, and, today, Florida is among the states with the lowest voter registration rates.

Some of the proposed changes pushed by legislators around the country are especially outrageous: In 2023, a GOP legislator in Texas tried to eliminate all campus polling places. That particular piece of legislation didn't make it out of committee. But, a few years earlier, the legislature did ban the

distribution of unsolicited mail-in ballot applications, meaning that many students (a group that was particularly likely to vote by mail in 2020) who might have voted by mail had they known they had the opportunity to do so now may never find out they can. In Montana — where Democratic Sen. Jon Tester is in a tough fight against his Republican challenger in a race that will likely determine control of the U.S. Senate legislators passed a law barring the mailing of mail-in ballots to residents who aren't vet 18 but will be by the date of the election; another law eliminated Election Day voter registration, which has, historically, been disproportionately used by young voters. And during his ill-fated campaign, one-time presidential candidate Vivek Ramaswamy even proposed raising the voting age to 25, thus at a stroke eliminating the problem of pesky liberal students boosting Democratic candidates' chances.

Late last month, the Institute of Politics at the Harvard Kennedy School released a national poll showing Harris with a more than 30 percent lead over Trump among young voters. Even that likely understated the scale of Harris's lead, since the poll also found that young Democrats were more likely to vote than were their Republican counterparts, and a massive gender gap, with women favoring Harris.

Trump isn't going to overcome these numbers by a campaign of persuasion aimed at young voters, but the yearslong campaign by GOP legislators to pass state laws making it harder for young people to vote might partially accomplish this same goal.

Rufus Wainwright Issues Statement After His Version Of "Hallelujah" Is Played At A Donald Trump Event

he night of October 14, at a Donald Trump town hall in Oaks, Pennsylvania, that NPR characterized as going "from a Q-and-A session to a bizarre musical event in which Trump stood in front of his audience for an extended period while songs played on the sound system," numerous songs were played. Among the songs was singer songwriter Rufus Wainwright's version of Leonard Cohen's seminal "Hallelujah." Wainwright, who is supporting Kamala Harris, was horrified upon learning of this and today issues this statement:

I've been supremely honored over the years to be connected with this ode to tolerance. Witnessing Trump and his supporters commune with this music last night was the height of blasphemy. Of course, I in no way condone this and was mortified, but the good in me hopes that perhaps in inhabiting and really listening to the lyrics of Cohen's masterpiece, Donald Trump just might experience a hint of remorse over what he's caused. A Local LGBTQ+ Perspective on Breast Cancer by Courtney Quinn

Tt's serendipitous to share in this Pet Issue that my wife and I had two small dogs who often excitedly jumped on me, and in 2017, I thought the dogs had given me a bruise on my breast. That bruise was a lump and led to my breast cancer diagnosis.



Today, I'm the Executive Director for the Albie Aware Breast Foundation, the largest local nonprofit organization dedicated solely to breast cancer in the greater Sacramento area. As I reflect on what I didn't know when I found that "bruise", there is information I want to make sure our LGBTQ+ community knows this breast cancer awareness month.

When should you start having breast cancer screenings?

Albie Aware recommends a clinical breast exam and screening mammogram annually for individuals 40 years or older. If an individual has a family history, genetic markers, or any symptoms they may need a mammogram more frequently and/or before age 40.

When should you stop having a yearly mammogram?

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recommends stopping at age 74, yet we recommend you have a conversation with your primary care doctor about when to stop. This August, at the Rainbow Chamber of Commerce's Drag Queen Bingo, I met a local resident who was 75 years old when she was diagnosed, and she's now celebrating 9 years as a survivor. Personally, my mother turned 75 years old in May and asked me if she should stop getting mammograms. I shared that I thought she should continue because she had previously had colon cancer, and her mother had breast cancer. Less than six months later, my mother was diagnosed with breast cancer, and she will have surgery at the end of this month.

How is the LGBTQ+ community impacted by breast cancer?

Sadly, we know that populations facing health disparities are more likely to die from breast cancer. Black women are 41% more likely to die from breast cancer than white women and the leading cancer death among Latina/Hispanic women living in the U.S. is breast cancer. Because sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) data was not collected for decades, we lack the data to know the full impact of cancer for our community. What we do know is that some members of the LGBTQ+ community do not have full coverage health insurance, have a low level of trust in health care providers, and engage in a cluster of risk factors. In the last few years, major health organizations have released guidelines for breast cancer screenings for transgender people.

We know that our community may not have a relationship with their biological family, and we encourage you to talk to your health care provider about genetic

What's changing for the LGBTQ+ community related to breast cancer?

In 2022, the Prevent Cancer Foundation (PCF) supported 10 projects dedicated to increasing cancer prevention and early detection in LGBTQ+ communities and Albie Aware was one the selected organizations. The Prevent Cancer Foundation continues to be an ally and provides information for our community on cancer screenings.

Alongside PCF, we've been advocating for seniors to access multi-cancer early detection tests. These blood tests, such as the GRAIL Galleri Test, screen for breast cancer and many of the deadliest cancers before they become symptomatic.

What should I do if I need help getting a screening or have more questions?







Out, Proud, Latine: New Report Reveals Nearly 90% of Latine LGBTQ+ Youth Are Proud of Their Identity

The Human Rights Campaign Foundation (HRC), in collaboration with the HRSi–HRC's Latine affinity group has released a report focused on the experiences and challenges faced by Latine LGBTQ+ youth. The report, produced in partnership with the University of Connecticut, offers valuable insights based on data from around 2,200 Latine LGBTQ+ youth (ages 13-18) from across the United States. Its findings serve as a guide for caregivers, educators, and professionals working with Latine LGBTQ+ youth, providing a roadmap for better understanding and supporting this community.

"Despite the rejection, stigma, and bias that many Latine LGBTQ+ youth experience in both the queer and Latine communities, the overwhelming majority still take great pride in their identity," said Charleigh Flohr, Associate Director of Public Education & Research at HRC. "This community's resilience, despite significant hurdles, is inspiring. Through this report, we aim to highlight both the challenges and triumphs of Latine LGBTQ+ youth and

provide actionable steps to ensure they thrive.'

The report outlines the difficulties many Latine LGBTQ+ youth face, including rejection from family members, religious institutions, and the Latine community itself. They also face racism and bias within the broader LGBTQ+ community. These intersecting challenges often create a heavy emotional toll. Still, the majority of Latine LGBTQ+ youth report being proud of their identity, and many have shared their sexual orientation or gender identity with their families.

Orlando Gonzales, Senior Vice President of Programs, Research, and Training at HRC, emphasized the importance of support within the community. "As a gay Latino man, I know how crucial it is to feel embraced by your community. Unfortunately, many Latine LGBTQ+ individuals do not always receive the support they need to thrive. This report, created in

collaboration with HRSi, provides not only data but also actionable steps and resources for families and professionals who work with Latine LGBTQ+ youth."

Key Findings from the 2024 Latine LGBTQ+ Youth Report:

Racism, Homophobia, and Transphobia: 70.5% of Latine LGBTQ+ youth and 75.4% of Latine transgender youth have experienced racism in the LGBTQ+ community, while 78.7% of Latine LGBTQ+ youth report facing homophobia or transphobia in the Latine community.

Religion and Spirituality: Over 60% of youth raised in a religious setting felt their religion was unfriendly toward LGBTQ+ individuals, and 52.1% experienced feelings of guilt or shame due to religious beliefs.

Mental Health: More than half of Latine LGBTQ+ youth and 61.9% of transgender youth screened positive for depression, with many also reporting unmet mental health care needs.

Despite these challenges, 89.9% of Latine LGBTQ+ youth say they are proud of their LGBTQ+ identity, though 24.5% still wish they were not LGBTQ+.

We chose a couple items, Ahi tartare with ponzu cucumber, tobiko and wonton crisps, delicious and slightly sweet. I really wanted the truffle mac and cheese too, but will try that on the next visit. Next choice, Pacific Salmon, Ahi Nicoise, Hereford Filet or blackened Salmon Tacos. So many choices in a great location in Placerville just 10 minutes from the B&B.

After dinner we retreated back to Pondersa, in our dog friendly room to enjoy some wine on the deck and rocking chairs while listing to the musical sounds courtesy of the local wildlife sounds of crickets and other new friends.



















Day Two

Saturday morning we were greeted with homemade breakfast, of course some local apple juice and great conversations with the B& B owners and other guests too. Then off to our many stops to taste and eat all things apple and wine! There are so many to choose from and a list can be found on line or your innkeepers can give you a few ideas and favorites, plus maps to find the Ale Trail, Apple everything and did I mention wine?

Our first stop was Starfield Vineyards with a quick stop across the street to check out the 24 Carrot Farm Stand, with fruit stand, pick your own flowers and other farm stand treats. Starfield from the street looks like a lot of places with an iron gate, and an inviting road up the hill but inside it is so amazing. Starfield opened in 2019 and has a great family story to tell. We were welcomed with a glass of blanc de blanc in main public tasting room with stunning vineyard views and friendly staff.

The Starfield is dog friendly, so there were lots of pups to pet if you do not have your own dog. Theo took care of us in the main tasting room. We enjoyed a visit to their lake that is reservered for members only, with a charcuterie plate consisting of house-made pork pickled grapes and other nibbles. We are fortunate

to live in our area with tons of wineries but I must say the Starfield is now one of our new favorites, and the lake alone is worth joining, the club, so we did!

We loved the Santa Cruz Mt Chardonnay, one of three wines not estate grown, the Rhône style white was both acidity tart with a leemongrass note. The Miners Inch, their flagship wine (first vintage of the winery), was slightly dry, complex and delicious! And, not on the list, a Pinot noir, Petaluma Gap - gaps crown vineyard Sonoma.

Next up, Delfino Farms, another dog friendly location which included their farm dog pup and a visit to see their baby doll sheep, they were so cute! Delfino offered up some great wines with a spectacular view. In addition to the wine, we had Hard cider that had been dry aged in oak. Delfino hosted an Annual Snout to Tail dinner that this year they partnered with Cannon Restaurant in Sacramento. Like many wineries, they also host Summer concert series called "Folk on the Farm."



After a little nap back at the Ponderosa we enjoyed dinner at Smith Flat House. The steak salad we ordered was huge, and along with that we also enjoyed roasted asparagus and jambalaya risotto, also delicious. The restaurant was in the middle of hosting a large wedding so we were able to enjoy our dinner in the lower historic room, which was a rare treat.

Day Three

After a very restful night we enjoyed another amazing breakfast at our B& B along with lovely conversation with the hosts. After breakfast we checked out some of the many apple farms and then hit up Lava Cap Winery. We enjoyed conversation with our server Jen who shared stories about the family farm, all things apple and of course wine too, we enjoyed Mouvedre, a limited production 2022, 2021 Petit Syrah that displayed no smokey flavor, despite the fires that year.

After that, we bid a very fond farewell to Eldorado and headed home to Sacramento. The short drive up there was easy, and no matter if you make it a day trip or spend the whole weekend, the area has so much to offer and is very LGBTQ friendly. We had a wonderful, restful weekend and look forward to going back for another

In celebration of National Lost Pet Prevention Month, LawnStarter set out to determine the most pup-friendly cities in the U.S. for 2024 by ranking the Best Dog Park Cities. 





Celebration Arts and Cap Stage Come Through by Chris Narloch

wo thought-provoking plays about race and what it means to be a minority in America are now playing on Sacramento stages. Read on for my reviews.

Celebration Arts

This theater is currently operating out of one of the spaces that previously housed B Street Theatre, before those folks moved to The Sofia on Capitol Avenue in midtown Sacramento. Celebration Arts continues to explore the Black experience in America with "Crumbs from the Table of Joy," an early play by Lynn Nottage, the great playwright whose works include "Ruined," 'Sweat," and "Clyde's."

"Crumbs from the Table of Joy" is not quite in the same league as those masterworks, but it is worth seeing both on its own merits and as a starting point if you've never seen a play by Nottage, who is one of the most consistent and talented playwrights currently working in this country.



Set against the social politics of the 1950s, the play's bittersweet story follows 17-year-ol Ernestine after she and her sister and her father move from Florida to Brooklyn and find a less than welcoming neighborhood. The sisters must navigate a new family dynamic as well, after their widowed father marries a white woman.

Thanks to the solid direction of Imani Mitchell, the five-person cast mostly rises to the emotional demands of the script, even though a couple of the roles are not ideally cast. I did especially enjoy the performance given by James Ellison III, as the dad.

Nothing momentous happens in "Crumbs..." but Nottage isn't interested in manufactured melodrama. Her strengths lie in the connections between her characters - or lack of connection - and her unerring ability to write dialogue that sounds like real speech.

This theater's latest offering, Lloyd Suh's "The Heart Sellers," is a co-production with Aurora Theatre Company in Berkeley and TheatreWorks Silicon Valley, and the play hits the stage at Capital Stage like a well-oiled machine.

The seemingly simple story, about two Asian immigrants who meet in a grocery store and bond over their shared experiences (and a bottle of wine), takes us inside the journey of two American dreamers who sometimes feel like strangers in a strange land.

Lloyd Suh and director Jennifer Chang do a fine job of doling out the play's small surprises, and this production's success has much to do with two terrific actresses, Nicole Javier and Wonjung Kim, who bring their characters to vivid life gradually and with great skill.

The characters of Jane and Luna at first seem like Asian caricatures (an eager to please chatterbox and a timid mouse who speaks broken English) but there is much more to the women than initially meets the eye. The same goes for the play itself, which is sold with a great deal of heart thanks to Suh, Chang, and the two wonderful women who costar in this





Tatching scary movies in October is a ritual for horror film fans like me, and this year as always there are several new additions to the fright flick filmography. So, after you're done binging Ryan Murphy's latest trashy true-crime series on Netflix, about the Menendez brothers, you can check out one or more of these horrifying films.

Smile 2

The first "Smile" movie was a surprise hit two years ago, with audiences and most critics, thanks to its novel gimmick and surprisingly strong acting and direction. The inevitable sequel attempts to go bigger and better, and it's a case of more is less. I can recommend it with some reservations, but "Smile 2" is not a gem like the original.



highlighted by a newly commissioned short documentary film, "Why?," directed by Matt Lambert, which also premiered to mark this 40th anniversary.














