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

The New Right-Wing Bureaucracy Has Progressive Nonprofits In Their Crosshairs by Truthout.org

ith H.R. 9495 (the "nonprofit killer" bill) still in the pipeline, any organization could have its tax-exempt status revoked without due process, decided by a political appointee. Elsewhere, as agencies clamber to comply with new executive orders, the availability of federal funds for a wide range of nonprofits (from media to social services) is in question.

With the newly-minted "Department of Government Efficiency" taking the reins, the Bureau of Fiscal Service could face disruption, leaving long-lasting effects on the sector if organizations are forced to close or temporarily suspend operation due to lack of on-time payment.

At the same time, the need for nonprofit and independent journalism is growing. For-profit media is increasingly under corporate control, with news writers across the country juggling editorial independence with advertising and the interests of billionaire ownership. Organizations with the independence and ethics of Truthout are few and far between, and our number is shrinking still. truthout.org/

The next four years will be a frightening time for independent journalism. As Truthout Editor-in-Chief Negin Owliaei put it recently, "We see the Trump era as a large-scale attack on the idea of a public commons."

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
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Stonewall Monument's Transgender History Scrubbed by Trump Administration

The National Park Service recently erased references to queer and transgender people from the Stonewall National Monument website, sparking outrage among transgender activists.

The monument commemorates the historic of gendered dress codes. Although no law New York City gay bar where LGBTQ activists – including transgender trailblazers Marsha P. Not only did the[y] remove the [word] Transgender' but changed 'LGBTQ+' to 'LGBQ+'. The federal government is attempting to erase us and take away our history," transgender legislative researcher and activist Allison Chapman said on Bluesky. "This pride, we riot." The Park service also later removed the word "queer" and the "Q+" from the web

The New York Times reported that the Park Service's public affairs department said the website changes were made to comply with Donald Trump's anti-trans executive order, aimed at "restoring biological truth to the federal government." The department also referenced a second order issued last month by the acting Secretary of the Interior.

The erasure of trans history aligns with Trump's anti-trans executive order, which requires the federal government to recognize only male and female as legal genders. Following this directive, agencies like the State Department, Centers for Disease Control, and Department of Veterans Affairs have reduced "LGBTQ+" to "LGB," eliminated references to transgender, queer, and intersex people, and removed related web pages and datasets. In fact, according to the Center for American Progress, the Trump administration has taken down over 350 government web pages containing LGBTQ policies, information and resources.

"The Stonewall Inn and The Stonewall Inn Gives Back Initiative are outraged and appalled by the recent removal of the word transgender' from the Stonewall National Monument page on the National Park Service website," the Stonewall Inn said in a statement. "This blatant act of erasure not only distorts the truth of our history, but it also dishonors the immense contributions of transgender individuals — especially transgender women of color – who were at the forefront of the Stonewall Riots and the broader fight for LGBTQ+ rights."

Trans activists say that by stripping references to transgender and queer people from the Stonewall National Monument website, the Park Service is erasing a crucial part of the history it is meant to preserve.

"Trans women were some of the most influential activists behind the Stonewall movement and what followed. 3 articles of clothing laws were why raids happened," transgender journalist and activist Erin Reed said on Bluesky.

The 1969 uprising at the Stonewall Inn was, in part, a response to police enforcement

explicitly required Americans to wear at least three articles of clothing matching their assigned sex, queer historian Hugh Ryan notes that police frequently used various statutes – informally known in queer circles as the "three-article rule" — to criminalize and arrest people who defied gender norms. Transgender and gender-nonconforming people were frequent targets of these raids.

On June 28, 1969 some of the most relentlessly policed - transgender women, drag queens, and homeless LGBTQ youth - fought back, sparking a movement that became a defining moment in the fight for LGBTQ rights.

Stonewall," LGBTQ program director for Media Matters, Ari Drennen, said on X. "Now, the Trump administration is trying to write us out of that history. We will not let them."

Transgender activists emphasized how the Trump administration even went so far as to remove mentions of Sylvia Rivera's advocacy for trans rights from the Stonewall National Monument website. The page now reads: "At a young age Sylvia began fighting for gay and rights." Rivera was a drag queen, gay liberationist, and transgender rights activist who resisted arrest that night and later organized LGBTQ protests in response to the raid.

"Let us be clear: Stonewall is transgender history," the Stonewall Inn said. "Marsha P. Johnson, Sylvia Rivera, and countless other trans and gender-nonconforming individuals fought bravely, and often at great personal risk, to push back against oppressive systems. Their courage, sacrifice, and leadership were central to the resistance we now celebrate as the foundation of the modern LGBTQ+ rights movement."

In response to this anti-trans revisionism, over 1,000 protesters in New York City said "hell no!" to the erasure of transgender contributions to history. The protesters gathered on Friday at Christopher Park, which is across the street from the Stonewall Inn, and yelled "Stand up fight back!" and "No LGB without the T!"

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RFK Jr. Will Bring Anti-LGBTQ+ Resume to His New Position resources: AP NEWS, HRC.org

obert F. Kennedy Jr. has been confirmed as the 26th Secretary to addiction. of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) under President Donald Trump. The Senate confirmed his nomination on February 13, 2025, with a narrow 52-48 vote

Kennedy, known for his controversial views on vaccines, faced significant opposition during his confirmation process. In December 2024, over 75 Nobel Laureates urged the Senate to reject his nomination, expressing concerns that his appointment could jeopardize public health. Additionally, more than 17,000 doctors signed an open letter opposing his confirmation, citing his history of promoting vaccine misinformation.

Despite the controversy, Kennedy was sworn in on February 13, 2025, by Associate Justice Neil Gorsuch in the Oval Office. Immediately following his swearing-in, President Trump signed Executive Order 14211, establishing the "Make America Healthy Again" (MAHA) Commission, which Kennedy will chair. The commission aims to investigate the causes of chronic childhood diseases and assess the impact of various prescription medications, including antidepressants and stimulants.

Kennedy's confirmation has sparked debate, particularly due to his past statements on vaccines and pharmaceuticals. During his confirmation hearings, he claimed that antidepressants are as addictive as heroin, a statement that experts have refuted, emphasizing that antidepressants do not lead

Misinformation on AIDS, Anti-LGBTO+ Claims, and Opposition to Trans Youth



AIDS Denialism: Kennedy has repeatedly denied that HIV causes AIDS, falsely claiming that "phony, crooked studies" misled the public and that AIDS is "not a viral disease" but an "environmental" condition. These claims contradict decades of scientific research that have led to life-saving treatments for HIV/AIDS.

Anti-LGBTQ+ Misinformation: Kennedy has promoted the debunked notion that chemicals in the environment are responsible for youth identifying as LGBTQ+, stating that these substances are "inducing profound sexual changes" in children. His claims are based on questionable research conducted solely on

Opposition to Trans Youth Healthcare: During his failed presidential campaign, Kennedy opposed healthcare for transgender youth, asserting that care "should be deferred till adulthood." He also echoed common misinformation about gender-affirming care while ignoring the overwhelming support for such care from major medical associations.

As he assumes leadership of HHS, Kennedy's policies and initiatives are expected to influence various aspects of public health, including vaccination programs and pharmaceutical regulations. His tenure will likely be closely monitored by both supporters and critics.

A4TE Condemns Robert F. Kennedy Jr. Confirmation as HHS Secretary

he Senate confirmed Robert F. Kennedy Jr. (RFK Jr.) as United States Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS). In response, Sinead Murano-Kinney, Health Policy Analyst at Advocates for Trans Equality, issued the following statement:

"By measures of expertise and character, Robert F. Kennedy Jr. is unfit and unqualified for this position. We look to the Secretary of HHS to protect the health and well-being of all. RFK Jr. has consistently proven he is incapable of grasping, let alone upholding, the principles of equity and scientific integrity. His disregard for scientific evidence and embrace of misinformation endanger vulnerable populations, including trans people, intersex people, people living with HIV, and low-income families relying on Medicaid.

"His rejection of scientific consensus threatens access to critical healthcare, from vaccines to transgender healthcare. Despite claims he would 'follow the science,' RFK Jr. has previously promoted conspiracy theories such as 5G misinformation, making xenophobic claims that COVID-19 was engineered to target certain populations, he's compared vaccination mandates to the Third Reich and the Holocaust, and demonstrates a fundamental misunderstanding of public health programs.

"His appointment is particularly alarming for trans and intersex Americans, as he is now responsible for enforcing some of

President Trump's most harmful executive orders targeting our communities. RFK Jr. has falsely described essential transitionrelated care as 'castration drugs,' ignoring decades of research confirming the safety and necessity of transition-related treatment in reducing suicidality and improving mental health. He has also made unsubstantiated claims that the existence of trans people is the result of chemical exposure from our drinking water, based entirely off a single study conducted on frogs.

"RFK Jr. has demonstrated that he will not be guided by scientific integrity or values of equity. Instead, he will be nothing more than a conspiratorial figurehead, a yes-man, enabling the worst impulses of a President with a clear agenda to remove trans people from participating in public life. His leadership signals a dangerous era where disinformation dictates policy, harming those most in need of care.

"We applaud the Senators who rejected this appointment and reaffirmed their commitment to equitable healthcare. We look forward to continuing our work with them to protect the health and dignity of trans people nationwide.'

resources: Gallup.com, NPR s of 2024, approximately 7.6% of U.S. adults identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or another nonheterosexual orientation. This reflects a steady increase from previous years, with 7.1% in 2021 and 5.6% in 2020.

The rise in LGBTQ+ identification is particularly notable among younger generations. In 2024, about 22.3% of Generation Z adults (born 1997-2012) identified as LGBTQ+, compared to 9.8% of Millennials (born 1981-1996), 4.5% of Generation X (born 1965-1980), 2.3% of Baby Boomers (born 1946-1964), and 1.1% of the Silent Generation (born before 1946).

Among LGBTQ+ adults, bisexuality is the most common identification. In 2024, 57.3% of LGBTQ+ individuals identified as bisexual, 18.1% as gay, 15.1% as lesbian, 11.8% as transgender, and 4.2% as another LGBTQ+ identity, such as pansexual.

These trends suggest a growing acceptance and willingness among younger individuals to openly identify as LGBTQ+.



merica finds itself in yet another unprecedented moment in history. This time, our democracy teeters on the edge **∠ L**of a national crisis. On January 20, 2025, Donald J. Trump was inaugurated for a second term. The same president who mishandled the COVID-19 outbreak is once again shaping the course of our country. Barely two weeks into his presidency, the nation is already unraveling.

You don't have to be a constitutional scholar to see the chaos. Political turmoil at this scale hasn't been seen since Watergate. This time, however, the stakes are even higher. Billionaire Elon Musk poured over \$200 million into Trump's campaign and now holds an unofficial seat in government, heading the newly created Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE). Federal agencies have been gutted, mass layoffs have hit government workers, and critical programs—especially those supporting working-class families, small businesses, students, and public safety-are being slashed. DEI initiatives, including LGBTQ+ protections, are vanishing as Project 2025 is fast-tracked into reality.

In search of community amid the chaos, I

found information about the 50/50/1 Protest: 50 protests in 50 states on a single day. Living in Sacramento, the site of California's state capitol, I knew I had to show up.

On Wednesday, February 5, at 11:30 AM, I arrived at the California State Capitol unsure of what to expect. I didn't know anyone attending, and I wasn't certain of my safety. But I knew that silence was not an option. As I walked toward the capitol, I spotted others heading in the same direction. One man, who had driven 45 minutes and skipped a snow day, walked beside me. By noon, over 1,000 people filled the capitol steps—families, students, workers, activists, nonprofit leaders, and even state employees. Protest signs filled the air as voices united in outrage and determination. I spoke with several protesters about why they were there:

Beatrix (she/her/they): "I'm here to represent Trans Rights and have a voice for democracy. This country belongs to the people, not just those in power.'

Nicole (she/her): "There aren't enough signs to express my outrage. I've never felt this helpless before, but I refuse to give up. Women are under attack, and I want to fight for their future, just as my mother fought for mine." A protester nearby chimed in, "And I fought for! I can't believe I have to do this again!"

Rhonda (she/her) of sacpoderosa.org: "We're here as Chicanas to fight against discrimination and the destruction of our communities. This is about social justice and equity."

Margarita (she/her), local activist, emphasized the bigger picture: "We must push back, but not just to maintain the status quo. What are we envisioning? What kind of democracy do we want? Because even before this, many communitiespeople of color, LGBTQ folks, undocumented individuals-weren't fully protected." She concluded, "Let's be honest

about what we're organizing for and fight for real systemic change."

History is rhyming. The rights, laws, and protections that past generations fought for are being stripped away. We cannot afford to sit idly by. Margarita's words remind us that resistance alone is not enough—we must envision and build something better. Learning our full history, including Black History, Ethnic Studies, and the untold struggles of marginalized communities, is crucial to understanding what's at stake.

This moment calls for more than just protest-it demands action. Now is the time to vote harder, practice civic engagement, and use our collective voice. Democracy depends on participation.

enator Scott Wiener issued a strong response to President Trump's recent executive orders, which target transgender youth, their families, and teachers.




condemned Trump's actions, calling them cruel, illegal, and an attempt to scapegoat transgender youth to distract from his administration's failures in addressing economic and immigration iss ues. He emphasized that California will

They also attempt to restrict transgender youth's access to necessary and potentially life-saving healthcare, even with parental support. Additionally, the orders seek to undermine California's status as a sanctuary state for transgender youth, challenging protections established under SB 107, a law authored by Wiener in 2022. In his statement, Wiener strongly

continue to stand with transgender and nonbinary young people, their families, and their teachers, ensuring their rights and well-being are protected. He vowed to resist these federal measures using all available resources and reaffirmed the state's commitment to safeguarding the dignity and safety of transgender individuals.







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Attorney General Bonta Provides Guidance for Businesses on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility Initiatives in the Workplace

alifornia Attorney General Rob Bonta, along with 15 other attorneys general, issued guidance to help businesses, nonprofits, and organizations understand the legality and importance of diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) initiatives in the workplace.

This response follows concerns raised by President Trump's executive order, which aims to challenge private-sector DEIA policies. The guidance asserts that DEIA initiatives remain legal and cannot be prohibited through executive order, emphasizing their benefits for businesses, employees, and economic growth.

Bonta highlights that civil rights laws such as the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Americans with Disabilities Act have strengthened the country by fostering fairness and inclusivity. He urges California businesses to ignore political scare tactics, reaffirming that diverse and inclusive workplaces drive innovation and economic success. The guidance clarifies that DEIA policies differ from unlawful hiring preferences, instead ensuring fair recruitment, hiring, and retention processes that support all employees and promote a sense of belonging.

The document stresses that courts have long upheld DEIA policies as lawful and necessary for compliance with anti-discrimination laws. Employers are legally required to evaluate their policies to prevent discrimination. Research supports that properly implemented DEIA initiatives help identify, report, and address workplace discrimination effectively.

Furthermore, the guidance underscores the business benefits of DEIA, citing studies showing that companies prioritizing diversity outperform

their peers financially, experience lower turnover, and attract top talent. It outlines best practices for recruitment and hiring, such as expanding applicant outreach, using panel interviews to reduce bias, and setting standardized evaluation criteria. Employers are also encouraged to ensure accessibility in hiring and provide reasonable accommodations.

For retention and professional development, the guidance recommends equal access to training and mentorship programs, the establishment of Employee Resource Groups, and workplace training on unconscious bias, inclusive leadership, and disability awareness. These efforts create supportive environments where employees feel valued and heard.

The guidance reaffirms that businesses committed to DEIA initiatives are not only legally compliant but also more successful and inclusive. Bonta's coalition, including attorneys general from multiple states, stands in support of businesses seeking to maintain fair and thriving workplaces.

Attorney General Bonta Sues Trump Administration, Challenging Elon Musk's Unconstitutional Exercise of Power

onta, alongside 13 other attorneys general, has filed a lawsuit against the Trump administration, challenging Elon Musk's alleged unconstitutional exercise of power. The lawsuit argues that Musk, an unelected and unconfirmed government figure, is unlawfully wielding authority as head of the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), a position not created by Congress nor confirmed by the Senate. The coalition contends that Musk's actions violate the U.S. Constitution's Appointments Clause and seeks to halt his continued exercise of power immediately.

Bonta criticizes Musk's role, asserting that the President has unilaterally granted him authority without proper legal procedures. He describes Musk's influence over federal agencies as reckless and chaotic, undermining public trust and causing harm to vital government functions. Bonta likens Musk's approach to a "bull in a china shop," accusing him of disrupting crucial systems that affect the daily lives of Americans.

The lawsuit details Musk's alleged overreach, including interference in federal agencies, unauthorized access to sensitive data,

and significant disruptions to state and local governments. The attorneys general argue that Musk's actions have jeopardized billions of dollars in federal funding for essential services like law enforcement, healthcare, and education, directly harming states such as California.

By filing this lawsuit, Bonta and his fellow attorneys general aim to restore constitutional order and prevent further unauthorized government interference.

The coalition includes attorneys general from New Mexico, Arizona, Michigan, Connecticut, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nevada,

Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington.

Attorney General Bonta Secures Preliminary Injunction Blocking DOGE's Access to Private Data

alifornia Attorney General Rob Bonta announced that the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York ✓has issued a preliminary injunction blocking the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) from accessing Americans' private data maintained by the U.S. Treasury Department. This decision follows a lawsuit filed by Bonta and 19 other attorneys general challenging DOGE's attempt to access sensitive financial information, including bank accounts and Social Security numbers.

Bonta praised the ruling, emphasizing that it protects Californians and Americans from the Trump Administration's overreach. The injunction extends a temporary restraining order granted shortly after the lawsuit was filed, preventing DOGE from infiltrating Treasury Department payment systems pending further court proceedings.

The lawsuit was prompted by reports that Elon Musk and his associates at DOGE had gained unprecedented access to the U.S. Treasury's payment infrastructure, managed by the Bureau of the Fiscal Service (BFS). This system handles trillions of dollars in government payments, supporting essential services such as Social Security, Medicare,

veterans' benefits, federal employee salaries, and tax refunds. The attorneys general argue that DOGE's access poses a significant risk to these vital financial transactions.

The complaint asserts that the Trump Administration has no legal or constitutional authority to grant DOGE access to the BFS payment systems. The attorneys general contend that this move represents a dangerous politicization of federal financial infrastructure, endangering millions of Americans who rely on government benefits. The preliminary injunction ensures that DOGE remains barred from accessing Treasury systems while the case proceeds.

Attorney General Bonta: California Remains Unwavering in Our Commitment to Protecting Gender-Affirming Care

onta, along with 17 other attorneys general, has filed an amicus brief supporting plaintiffs in PFLAG v. Trump, challenging the Trump Administration's

Executive Orders 14168 and 14187. These orders attempt to strip federal funding from institutions providing gender-affirming care for transgender youth under 19 and label gender identity as a "false" concept. The attorneys general argue that these actions are discriminatory and urge the court to grant a preliminary injunction to block their enforcement.

Bonta emphasizes that healthcare decisions, including gender-affirming care, should be made by patients, families, and doctors without political interference. He reaffirms California's commitment to protecting transgender rights and condemns the administration's efforts as unlawful and harmful. The amicus brief highlights that several states, including California, have enacted laws prohibiting discrimination based on gender identity, such as the Unruh Civil Rights Act and other civil rights protections.

The attorneys general cite extensive medical evidence supporting gender-affirming care as essential for transgender individuals' wellbeing. Research from the University of Washington shows that transgender youth receiving this care experience significantly lower rates of depression (60% lower odds) and suicidal thoughts (73% lower odds). Denving access to gender-affirming care, they argue, has devastating physical and mental health consequences.

The brief also describes the chaos and fear caused by the executive orders, with providers halting care and transgender youth experiencing increased distress. The Trevor Project reported a 700% spike in crisis service access since the election and a 46% increase in demand after Inauguration Day.

Despite California maintaining access to gender-affirming care, Bonta and his coalition stress the broader national impact. They reaffirm that federal courts have blocked funding cuts to gender-affirming care providers and that no federal law criminalizes such care. The brief is co-led by attorneys general from California, Massachusetts, and Maryland, along with officials from 15 other states.

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Exploring Legacy: Must-See Black History Month Art And Culture in Sacramento by Ozola Cody

Tounded by visual artist and community leader Shonna McDaniels, the Sojourner Truth African Heritage Museum is a cultural jewel housed in Sacramento's Florin Square, a historic hub and marketplace designed around Pan-Africanism.

Guided by the Ghanaian principle of 'Sankofa" – meaning to "go back and fetch it" — the museum encourages visitors to delve into the past to better understand the present.

"We have to go back and fetch what was lost. It's important for everyone to know about the contributions that Africans have made to the world. Most people do not know the truth," McDaniels said.

McDaniels' journey to become an art activist began in childhood. "My parents believed having a strong sense of identity was essential. Our home was filled with Black art," said McDaniels, who grew up in Sacramento. "I attended Shule Jumamosa [an African-centred school] in Oak Park in 1971, where we learned Swahili, celebrated Kwanzaa and practiced African dance."

A Journey Through History

Walking into the museum feels like stepping into a living timeline. It features installations that spark conversation. One standout is the "Golden Milk Project," designed by McDaniels herself. This installation confronts the historical practice of enslaved African women being forced to breastfeed the children of their enslavers.

There's a strong connection formed when a mother breastfeeds her baby recognizing the mother's face, feeling nurtured and taking in all the benefits of the milk," McDaniels said.

"But these women's own children were neglected, as they were denied the same nurturing from their mothers."

This installation is one of many exhibits at the museum that offers a powerful and unique portraval of the Black experience - and youth docents are often onsite to provide their insights into the space.

Youth docent and Sacramento City College student Myana Myrica often begins her tours by encouraging visitors to breathe in preparation for the heavy emotions the museum may evoke. "Breathing and being in the space with each other allows us to feel connected and know we're not alone," she said.

The museum's visual journey begins in ancient Africa, with statues depicting ancestors, animals and deities, symbolizing humanity's origins. Some art installations also challenge current narratives of the transatlantic slave trade, such as Lee McCormick's mixed-media piece portraying the harrowing journey of enslaved Africans, a haunting reminder that Africans in the Americas were stolen and did not immigrate here merely as workers.

Why It Matters

Despite the cultural and historical

significance of the SOIO Museum - the only of its kind in Sacramento that focuses on Black history and art - increased patronization could help its longevity, according to McDaniels.

We need everyone involved to ensure the museum is being supported. Currently, we do not have it," McDaniels said. "We're the only museum of this nature training children as docents. Now, our efforts are being duplicated around the world."

"As we enter a time when accessing information about diverse people or thoughts is being challenged, exposure to art and literature becomes even more critical," artist Daphne Burgess, whose work "Snappin' Beans" is displayed at the museum, said. "Spaces like the Sojourner Truth African Heritage Museum is essential, and Black History Month is the perfect time to support them.

Art Beyond The Museum

For those seeking even more artistic engagement this Black History Month, Sacramento offers

two other significant events:

"Fences" by August Wilson will be playing at Celebration Arts from Feb. 14 to March 2. This powerful play explores the complex dynamics of race, family and dreams deferred. Known for its gripping storytelling, Fences is a must-see for those who appreciate theatre's role in social commentary.



7ith 13 Oscar nominations, the most ever for a non-English language film, the trans-friendly Netflix movie "Emilia Perez" sent this year's Oscar race into high gear.

"Emilia Perez" was expected to do well, but the two nominations "The Apprentice" received came as a surprise to many Oscar watchers, who were happy to see Sebastian Stan and Jeremy Strong get recognized for their stellar work playing Donald Trump and Roy Cohn in a controversial biopic that bravely (and accurately) depicted both men as rotten to the core.


60 Years of the Mustang o celebrate the Ford Mustang's 60th Anniversary,

The Return of Bridget Jones Plus, Three New Horror Films

Twasn't in the mood for another Marvel movie at the moment, so I don't have a review of "Captain America: Brave New World" L for you, but I found three new scary shows and a funny rom com that you can enjoy – after you get caught up on new episodes of "The White Lotus" and "The Traitors."



Heart Eyes

Mason Gooding, the handsome son of Cuba Gooding Jr., is emerging as a popular "scream king," after starring in two "Scream" films in recent years. Gooding Jr. is a sexy guy, and he has a laidback quality that I appreciate. Here he costars in yet another slasher flick, with the very pretty Olivia Holt, as the intended target of the Heart Eyes Killer, who stalks and murders romantic couples every Valentine's Day. While not a classic, the movie gets the job done thanks to a surprisingly entertaining script that is a mash-up of rom-com and horror movie. The identity of the killers is disappointing and partly predictable, but overall, I enjoyed "Heart Eyes," which is currently in wide theatrical release.



The Monkey

Horrormeister Osgood Perkins, the director of last year's "Longlegs," returns with another over-hyped hit that gives Megyn a run for her money. This time the killer toy is a wind-up monkey in need of some dental work who beats on a drum, and then people die. Whereas Megyn personally kicked butt in her movie, the monkey just sends out bad vibes that cause people to expire in horrible ways. Several of those kill scenes are gruesome good fun, including death by bees and a wild, Benihana-like decapitation that had this critic laughing his head off. Unfortunately, "The Monkey" is not as creepy as "Longlegs," which benefitted from Nicolas Cage's batshit-crazy portrayal of the Devil. Osgood's new movie has a so-so Theo James in a dual role as the brothers who discover the monkey. Balancing horror and comedy is tricky, and I don't think Perkins got the recipe quite right in this movie, which is currently in wide theatrical release.



Companion

With AI on the horizon and robots ready to take over our lives, this genre-bending combination of horror, sci-fi and dark comedy is perfectly timed. Jack Quaid (the son of Dennis Quaid and Meg Ryan) costars with Sophie Thatcher as a jerky guy and his female robot companion, who is programmed to love him unconditionally and take care of all his needs. If you've ever seen an episode of "Westworld," you know that scenario is unlikely to go off without a hitch, and true to form Quaid's fem-bot wants revenge after his character tries to shut her down. Thatcher is perfect as the title character, who is equal parts scary and sympathetic, and the movie kept me guessing until the end. "Companion" was still in wide theatrical release as we went to press.



Bridget Jones: Mad About the Boy

The 55-year-old and still-adorable Renee Zellweger returns for what sounds like the last time in this fourth installment of the popular franchise about a British woman and her struggles with aging, her weight, work, and men (not necessarily in that order). If this is indeed the final movie, "Mad About the Boy" is a good way to go out since - despite a few inane scenes - the film has a lot going for it: Zellweger, of course, plus a hilarious performance from Hugh Grant, two adorable child actors, and two potential love interests for Bridget. Will she choose the beautiful boytoy played by Leo Woodall or the older guy who teaches at her child's school (handsome Chiwetel Ejiofor)? You'll just have to stream the movie on Peacock and see for yourself.

The Kennedy Center Has Canceled the Gay Men's Chorus World Pride Concert

'n February 2025, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts faced significant upheaval following President Donald Trump's self-appointment as chairman and the subsequent dismissal of key board members. This abrupt leadership change led to the cancellation of several WorldPride performances, notably those featuring LGBTQ+ artists.

One prominent cancellation was that of the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, D.C., who were set to perform "A Peacock Among Pigeons" with the National Symphony Orchestra as part of the Kennedy Center's Pride celebration. The chorus expressed deep disappointment, emphasizing their belief in music's power to educate and uplift, and lamented the lost opportunity to foster love, understanding, and community. Despite the setback, they announced plans to perform the piece during WorldPride 2025's Choral Festival at an alternative venue.

The Portland Gay Men's Chorus also voiced concerns over the Kennedy Center's decision, highlighting a growing trend toward silencing the queer community. Executive Director Mark McCrary noted that such cancellations have prompted LGBTQ+ choruses nationwide to reassess the safety and inclusivity of their performance spaces.

In addition to these cancellations, several artists withdrew from their scheduled performances at the Kennedy Center in protest. Actress Issa Rae canceled her event, citing an infringement on the institution's values. Similarly, the band Low Cut Connie withdrew, criticizing the new leadership's direction. These actions reflect a broader resistance within the arts community against the perceived politicization of the historically nonpartisan cultural

The upheaval at the Kennedy Center has ignited a national conversation about artistic freedom, inclusivity, and the role of politics in cultural institutions. As WorldPride 2025 approaches, many artists and organizations are seeking alternative venues to ensure that celebrations of LGBTQ+ culture and diversity continue unabated.



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
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Will "Warriors" Be Lin-Manuel Miranda's Next Broadway Blockbuster?

The recent "Warriors" CD is a fascinating collaboration between Lin-Manuel and playwright, singer-songwriter, and actress Eisa Davis that was executive-produced by Nas. Miranda has said that starting the project as an album allowed him to collaborate with some of his "dream collaborators."
