LGBTQ+ Study on Youth and Young Adult COVID-19 Vaccination Finds Surprising Results

ut Boulder County in partnership with El Centro AMISTAD and Unwoven Ventures with the leadership of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ+) and Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) youth created what may be the nation's first LGBTQ+ and BIPOC youth-led survey on COVID-19 vaccination uptake, acceptance, hesitancy, and resistance. A key finding of the survey is that economic disadvantage and race make a meaningful impact on vaccination rates and levels of acceptance.

"LGBTQ+ and BIPOC young people are too often ignored by the medical establishment and society. It was important to Out Boulder County and our partners to have youth lead the survey and to elevate voices in these too often ignored communities," said Mardi Moore, Executive Director of Out Boulder County which provides advocacy, services, programs and support to LGBTQ+ communities in Boulder County and beyond. "Understanding their views and attitudes toward COVID-19 vaccination is crucial to managing and ending this pandemic."

There were 420 respondents who met the criteria for inclusion in the survey. It consisted of 37 questions, was offered in both English and Spanish, and targeted youth ages 12 to 17 and young adults between the ages of 18 to 24.

"Studying vaccination rates as well as views, attitudes, and barriers to vaccination at these intersections of identities revealed valuable data that should inform efforts to promote vaccination," said Michal Duffy, Director of Education and Research at Out Boulder County. "The data clearly reveal that a person's socio-economic status and identity impacts their views toward vaccination and their successful uptake of the vaccine."

When it comes to understanding COVID-19 vaccine reluctance, this information is crucial to an effective community vaccination program, which requires participation by people of every age group and demographic.

Key Survey Findings Economic Status Impact on Vaccination

A key finding of this study is that economically disadvantaged respondents have lower rates of vaccination overall. Economic disadvantage made a much more significant impact on LGBTQ vaccination rates as compared to non-LGBTQ vaccination rates. The following bulleted data points illustrate this key finding.

- 40% of economically disadvantaged LGBTQ young adults ages 18-24 are vaccinated, where as the vaccination rates jump to 86% for those who are economically resourced. 70% of economically disadvantaged LGBTQ youth ages 12-17 are vaccinated compared to 81% who are economically resourced.
- All non-LGBTQ respondents ages 18-24, whether economically disadvantaged or

resourced, have a 78% vaccination rate. For vouth ages 12-17, economically disadvantaged non-LGBTQ respondents are vaccinated at a slightly higher rate of 61% than those who are economically resourced at a rate of 58%

The results also showed a significant relationship between race, economic advantage, and vaccination rates. Economically disadvantaged Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) respondents have a significantly higher vaccination rate than economically disadvantaged White respondents.

• For financially disadvantaged respondents ages 12-17, BIPOC youth reported a 68% vaccination rate compared to 57% for White respondents. For ages 18-24, the difference is even greater at 80% of BIPOC respondents compared to 27% of White respondents.

Vaccine Acceptance, Hesitancy, and Resistance

While economically disadvantaged respondents revealed lower vaccination rates overall, they reported higher rates of vaccine acceptance (50% vs 30%) and hesitancy (23% vs 11%) and lower vaccine resistance (27% vs 59%), than those who are financially resourced.

This demonstrates an opportunity to reach economically disadvantaged, unvaccinated vouth through innovative community-based

Another important finding is that BIPOC respondents have a significantly higher rate of vaccine acceptance and lower vaccine resistance than White respondents; this trend also holds true for Hispanic/Latinx respondents in comparison to non-Hispanic/ Latinx respondents. White, non-LGBTQ respondents reported the lowest vaccination rate compared to both LGBTQ and Non-LGBTQ BIPOC.

Additional cited concerns that present opportunities for educational outreach to youth and young adults include: impacts on fertility, interactions with other conditions, associated costs, and accessibility and availability of vaccines.

Regardless of vaccination status, all respondents have concerns. Overall, mental health (65%) and physical health (58%) are the greatest concerns.misconceptions could remove the primary barriers facing vaccineaccepting youth and young adults.



But then the pandemic happened, and our worlds changed forever. It became clear to me that in whatever capacity we chose it to look like Kae would be a forever partner in my life.

I had been in love with Kae since the



they didn't feel the same way, then I would gladly accept their friendship. The day they came out I knew if nothing else, I had to at least tell them. Throughout our friendship Kae always said I was the perfect guy. If only they could find someone like me to be with. I told them, and we began to see if just maybe we could make this thing work.

Here we are now almost a year later engaged, living in a home we bought, raising our children and animals together. Loving each other and healing with each

would turn out like this, but with a lot of hard work we are building a beautiful family. A magical life full of love and trust, built on a foundation of friendship. A lot of people say they married their best friend, but in our case, we truly did end up with our best friend.





Celebrate Black History Month With Music

Trom Stevie Wonder and Marvin Gaye back in the day, to ◀ Miguel and John Legend today, soulful male singers have made significant contributions to music history.

Of course, you don't have to be black to be a brilliant soul singer, as Adele, Sam Smith, Dusty Springfield, Joe Cocker, Van Morrison, and many others have shown.

Although soulful singers can come in any color today, soul music itself originated in the black community throughout the United States in the '50s and '60s, when performers like James Brown, Aretha Franklin, and all the amazing Motown artists reigned supreme.

To celebrate Black History Month this February, I decided to spotlight recent recordings by The Weeknd and also Anderson .Paak with Bruno Mars, three artists who definitely put soul in to their music. Here are those reviews.


The Weeknd - Dawn FM

The artist known as The Weeknd was born in Toronto, Ontario and is of Ethiopian descent. He is also one of the most successful and talented singer-songwriters making music today, in any genre.

He recently released his fifth studio album, and it's a doozy, with wacky spoken word passages in between killer beats and confessional lyrics.

The Weeknd is nothing if not adventurous, and when you take chances like he does, not everything is going to work. (There are several songs on Dawn FM that are more interesting lyrically than musically.)

Still, the good outweighs the so-so on the disc, and I especially enjoyed two passionate



and "Less Than Zero."

The artist, whose real name is Abel Makkonen Tesfaye, likes to change up his look and his public persona -- sometimes in provocative ways -- but he creates music that is ready-made for both the radio (or Spotify) and the club.

On Dawn FM's best tracks, The Weeknd sounds like he is ready for the weekend.

Silk Sonic -An Evening with Silk Sonic

This soulful supergroup is a collaboration between two of our finest male artists, Anderson .Paak and Bruno Mars, who toured together and then decided to make music together.

Anderson .Paak was born in Oxnard, CA and is of mixed African-American and Korean heritage. Mars, who some music fans mistakenly think is Black, hails from Hawaii and can claim Spanish, Puerto Rican, Filipino, and Ashkenazi Jewish ancestry.

Since I am less of a hip-hop guy and more of a retro-soul fan, I absolutely loved An Evening with Silk Sonic, which leans more toward Mars' polished, pop-soul sound. Silk

Sonic brings old-school soul into the 21st Century thanks to the duo's skill and attitude. The pair shrewdly take the braggadocio that is so prevalent in hip-hop, apply it to '70s soul, and the result is a CD that sounds like today and yesterday at the same time. The three well-chosen singles from the album are probably the best examples of this.

The first single, "Leave the Door Open," is a hilarious come-on from a player to one of his beloveds, and it includes these classic lyrics: 'If you smoke, I got the haze / And if you're


On "Skate," the second single from An Evening with Silk Sonic, the two men flatter a woman with this crazy compliment: 'Mmm, you smell better than a barbecue'.

The third single, "Smokin' Out The Window," disses an errant girlfriend with this amusing putdown: 'got her badass kids runnin' 'round my whole crib / like it's Chuck E. Cheese'.

Mars has been attacked by some haters for sounding karaoke, and there are moments when the cleverness on An Evening with Silk Sonic wears thin. Yet the duo's love for soul music is so genuine, and their musicianship so undeniable that I couldn't help but have a smile on my face while I listened to this CD.






Super Smart Trans Woman Amy Schneider Takes Jeopardy By Storm

Not since the heyday of Irwin Allen in the '70s has Hollywood produced a shlocky big-budget film this fun. (Allen was the producer of "The Poseidon Adventure" and "The Towering Inferno," the two finest disaster movies made during the decade when that genre was at its peak of popularity.) "Moonfall," which stars Halle Berry and Patrick Wilson as two former NASA astronauts who must return to space to keep the moon from leaving its orbit and crashing into Earth, is one of those rare movies that is so bad it's good. The entire film is preposterous from start to finish, and my jaw felt like it was on the floor by the end. Many of the effects in "Moonfall" are amazing and some are cheesy, but the energy and the entertainment never fail. Every time I thought that this crazy movie couldn't get any more ridiculous, the filmmakers surprised me and topped themselves. "Moonfall" is currently in wide release in theaters, and it's a hoot.



Curana

The great Peter Dinklage gives an Oscar-caliber performance as the title character in the latest adaptation of Edmond Rostand's timeless tale of a selfless guy who helps another man woo the woman that they both love. This version of the story is based on a recent stage musical by Dinklage's wife that follows Rostand's play very closely. The new "Cyrano" is still a period piece (this time with stunning Italian locations), but it's also a musical now which makes it the most fun and fresh interpretation since Steve Martin's "Roxanne" in 1987. The lovely music in "Cyrano" was written by members of the band The National, and the fact that Dinklage is vertically-challenged makes for a very effective change from previous versions, in which an enormous nose kept Cyrano from having the nerve to pursue his beloved. Don't miss this terrific film and its superb lead performance. "Cyrano" is currently scheduled to open at the Tower on Feb. 25.



The Worst Person in the World

By the time you read this, "The Worst Person in the World" is likely to be a nominee for the best foreign film Oscar, which is now called "Best International Feature Film." (The nominations were scheduled to be announced on Feb. 8, the day this issue of Outword hit the streets.) This Norwegian film already won the Best Actress award at the Cannes Film Festival for Renate Reinsve's stunning performance as a young woman in Oslo who drifts from job to job and man to man trying to find meaning in her life. Co-written and directed by the very talented Joachim Trier, "The Worst Person in the World" explores love, life and death with a depth rarely seen in American movies. Fans of foreign films should not miss it. The movie is currently scheduled to open at Sacramento's Tower Theatre on Feb. 18.



Nightmare Alley: Vision in Darkness and Light

Whether I like it or not, we are living in a Marvel world now -- one where millennial moviegoers have no interest in old-school Hollywood period pieces like "Nightmare Alley" and "West Side Story." That makes me sad, but I'll keep going to bat for these underdog film flops that ought to be blockbusters. ("Nightmare Alley," which was originally wide-released on December 17, returned only about one-sixth of its \$60 million budget at the U.S. box office before disappearing from theaters.) I will admit that the movie is long and dark, but it's also beautifully directed by Guillermo del Toro and features one of the finest casts of any film in recent memory. Bradley Cooper stars as a soulless drifter headed to hell, and he finds it in the film's shocking final scene. After the movie bombed, del Toro decided to re-release it in this beautiful black-and-white version, and it has an even grittier film noir feel now. It's unheard of these days for a color film to be back in theaters in black-and-white, and "Nightmare Alley: Vision in Darkness and Light" will no doubt disappear fast all over again. I urge you to check it out if it's still playing anywhere around Sacramento.
